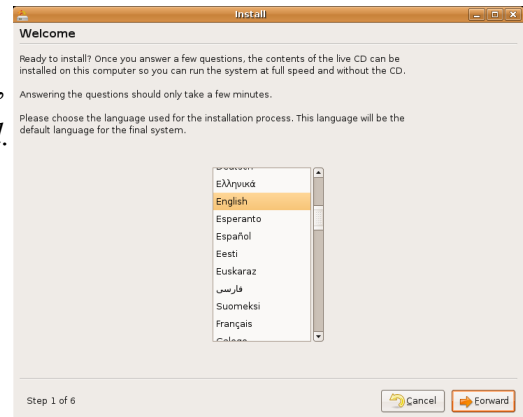


# How to install Ubuntu with Espresso

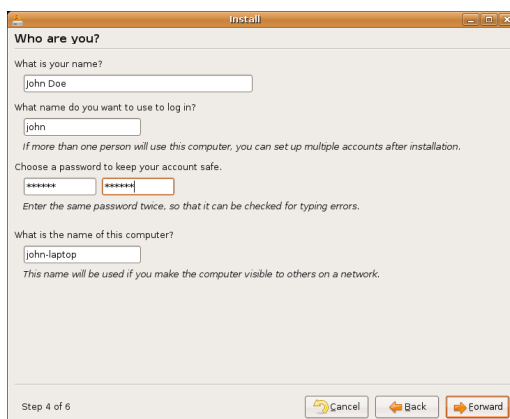
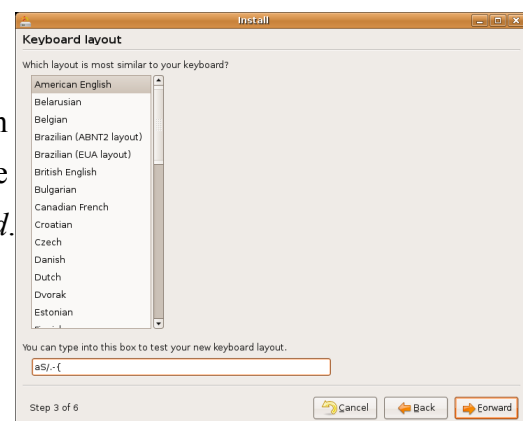
*Ubuntu* is installed within the Live CD session, you will be able to do some chatting and surfing while you are waiting for the system to install as well. You start the installation by clicking the *Install* icon on the desktop, *Espresso* makes the installation easier than ever with just a handful numbers of questions! The *Ubuntu team* have managed to keep everything you need for the live CD and installation in just one CD! Remember to check that you have the right CD for your computer before you start: for PCs chose the *x86 version*, if you have a 64-bit processor you may choose the *64AMD version*, if you are using a Mac chose *PowerPC*. Here are the step by step procedure with some neat pictures to help you through, in less than 30 minutes you should be sitting in your newly installed operating system.

**Step 1:** This is the first screen you will see, choose language and then click *Forward*.

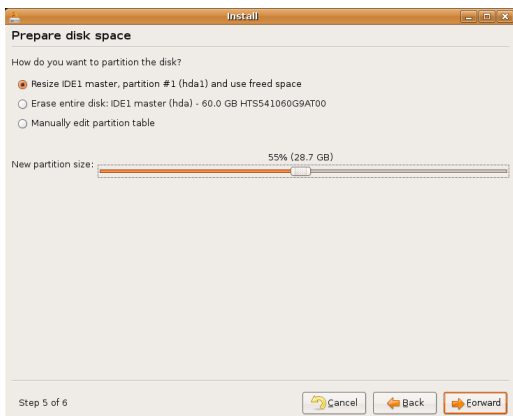


**Step 2:** Choose your *location* on the map or with the drop down menu to set the clock, click *Forward*.

**Step 3:** Select your "*Keyboard layout*", you can check your keyboard by entering text in the little windows at the bottom. Click *Forward*.

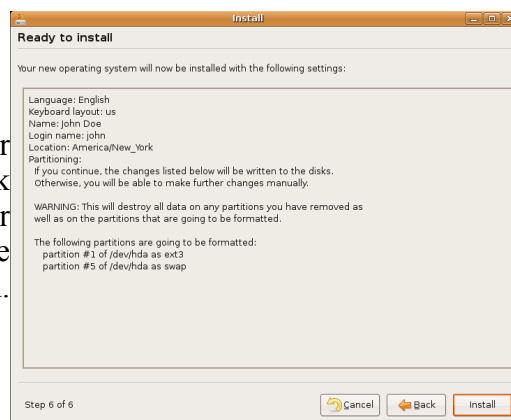


**Step 4:** Type in: *user name*, *log in name*, *password* and *name of your computer*, choose password wisely. Then you can continue by clicking *Forward*.



**Step 5:** Partition, here you will have to make some crucial decision to your hard drive. If you want to dual boot with for example *Windows*, choose the first option, if you want *Ubuntu* to take over the entire hard drive choose the option in the middle, for advanced users who wants full control should choose to do it manually by selecting the bottom option . Then click *Forward* when you are done.

**Step 6:** Now it is time to check that everything is in order and a last chance to *cancel* the installation. If you click *install*, a little windows will pop up and show you have far the progress is, you may chat and surf as you like, but be aware of speed reduction.



When the installation is done, usually under 30 minutes, a new windows will pop up telling you that *Ubuntu* is finished installing and you may reboot to start your newly installed OS or continue with the Live CD session if you like.

## The “Alternate install CD”

The *alternate install CD* allows you to perform certain specialist installations of *Ubuntu*. It provides for the following situations:

- creating pre-configured OEM systems;
- setting up automated deployments;
- upgrading from older installations without network access;
- LVM and/or RAID partitioning;
- installing GRUB to a location other than the Master Boot Record;
- installs on systems with less than about 192MB of RAM.
